The National Curriculum for Art and Design 2023 - 2024

EYFS

Key Stage 1

Pupils should be taught:

- to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
- to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
- to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

Key Stage 2

Pupils should be taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Pupils should be taught:

- to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas
- to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials (for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay)
- about great artists, architects and designers in history.

Reception

First weeks self portrait project:

Entirely independent portraits.

During this term, we learn how to take care of resources and use drawing and painting tools with increasing control, using the correct grip.

Skill: Painting using watercolours to make our own Harvest fruit and vegetable baskets as well as colour mixing for Autumn oranges and browns. **Printing** using harvest time vegetables.

Christmas printing project:

Christmas card printing - 1 colour hand and foam printing. Parents have the opportunity to buy these cards through an external provider.

Skill: Sculpture

using salt dough to make their own diva lamps.

Children learn the pinch pot technique. Their lamps are decorated using paint and embellished for our Diwali celebrations.

Skill: Sculpture using paper and card to create a rocket for Bonfire Night celebrations. Children are shown the magic of how 2D rectangles and circles can transform into cylinders and cones.

Painting using ready mixed paint/collage.

Self portraits revisited.

Children have the opportunity to draw another portrait, this time using a different drawing tool show their development in the Understanding of the World, Physical Development and Expressive Arts and Design areas of the early years curriculum.

Skill: Collage using recycled materials to create sea-life inspired art linked to our sea-life topic.


Skill: (Primal) painting using natural dyes and stains from plants, herbs and soil.
